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The City Council would retain authority over certain major actions concerning these utilities, including approval of specified real estate transactions, certain long-term contracts, issuance of debt, and any sale, lease, abandonment, or other disposition of City-owned utilities as required by the Charter and Minnesota law. The Commission could be abolished only through a future charter amendment.
